From the Rector

Beloved in Christ,

It is a strange thing to look towards fall, and to think about not being with you. This is the time of year in which I would usually be planning educational offerings, working on liturgies, and anticipating fellowship opportunities like International Night and the spaghetti dinner. Instead, the Wardens are making plans for transition; the vestry are carrying the work of the parish forward; and people I do not yet know in Washington, D.C., are planning other offerings in another place.

What I want to say to you is this: the work of God in Christ Church is not and never has been *my* work, but *ours*. What we have done here, we have done together, through your hands and your willing spirit. Even our worship, which seems (at least during Communion) to be centered on the priest as the agent of Christ, is *liturgy*, which means "the work of the people." *You* are the beating heart of Christ Church, the body of Christ in this place.

Even as I prepare to leave this parish, plans



for Fall are moving forward. In this issue, you will read about educational offerings and special events. John Sheridan, our new Director of Music, is working closely with Pam Harbour, Penelope Lattimer, and the members of the Music and Black Heritage Committees to plan an outstanding monthly concert series which will begin in October. Christ Church will remain a vibrant parish with a rich array of spiritual, social, and cultural offerings.

This fall will also see a change in our liturgical pattern, which I began to plan months before I had any idea that I might consider a new call. For the last several years, we have been struggling with Youth Sunday, trying to find a pattern which would work well to incor-

porate our younger members into our liturgical leadership. I think it is time to admit that, while intentions were good, having the youth take on all the roles one Sunday a month has not been serving them or the parish well. Neither the kids nor our adult members seem to have much energy around that Sunday, which has exhibited consistently lower attendance than other Sundays. The result has been to segregate our youth from our adults, so that rather than appreciating the extraordinary gifts our younger members bring to our community, many members of our parish never give themselves an opportunity to see the kids or interact with them.

Perth Amboy**

Bishop George Cuncell will preside and preach at this special service to consecrate the burial site of slaves in St. Peter's Church graveyard.

As with many historic churches, St. Peter's is the resting place of slaves

of African descent who were "owned" by white parishioners and were buried in the graveyard without recognition.

In keeping with the anti-racism ministry of the Diocese of New Jersey, St. Peter's will place a marker to the memory of those unsung men, women, and children with the dedication: "In this hallowed ground lie the remains of people of African descent who were servants and slaves during the 1700s and 1800s. They are un-

known to us, but precious to God. In the Church's sin of racism, they were buried without recognition. This day we repent of that sin and lift them in prayer, committing ourselves to respecting the dignity of every human being in the name of Jesus Christ. Rest eternal grant to them, O Lord. August 10, 2011."

Clergy are invited to vest and process. Red stoles. A reception will follow.

MEN'S MINISTRY

—*Deacon Pete Cornell*

The Men's Ministry met for Bible study on July 10th at 9:00 AM, as we continued our study on the Sermon on the Mount (as found in Matthew). We are using a guide from the Lifeguide Bible Study, which has 12 sessions of reflection and questions on this very familiar story. We continued to study chapter 5, verses 17-20. Our discussions focused on two questions this month. First, we began to reflect on how we could reconcile the statements that only the very righteous will enter heaven, with the later statement that the poor in spirit will enter heaven.

The group began to discuss how we as people could ever understand the divine judgment of God. As an example, we discussed the case of a priest recently accepted from the Roman tradition, who had past charges of molestation and was now serving as a hospital chaplain in a restricted capacity. Could we reconcile with someone who has honestly atoned for their sins? Is there a threshold above which it is impossible to forgive? The second question we discussed was whether the two great commandments (to love God and each other) took precedent over others. We decided that there was precedent for

interpreting the teachings of the Church in the context of the two, especially when our understanding began to change on social issue (such as slavery and homosexuality).

The next meeting of the Bible Study group is scheduled for August 14th at 9:00 a.m., and we will conclude our study of Matthew 5:17-20. Please feel free to read the passage, and you can contact me if you would like the questions we will address ahead of the session.

Update on the Fall Dinner: We have begun to plan for the Fall Men's Dinner in support of out-

reach. The date is September 24th, and we will be setting the menu and other planning over the summer. Please contact Deacon Pete Cornell if you are willing to assist with what promises to be a great evening.

All men of the Parish are invited and encouraged to attend, we always have lively and interesting discussions as we explore who we are and how we can be better Christians in the role we play as men. Please contact Deacon Pete Cornell if you want more information or have any suggestions about how to improve this Ministry within the Parish.



Looking Forward...Christian Formation This Fall

Church school for youth and children will begin on **Sunday, September 11th**, the day we return to our fall schedule. Registration will take place on the two preceding Sundays, **August 28th** and **September 4th**, after each of the two services.

Godly Play, for children three-and-a-half years old through second grade, will be held in the Noah's Ark Room beginning at 9:30 a.m. It is a Montessori-based approach which seeks to engage children's imagination in the service of their faith through holy play, artistic response, and wondering. It also

includes age-appropriate worship. Children return to the sanctuary in time for Communion.

Rite 13, our offering for youth in the 6th and 7th grades, will be held from 9:30-10:20 a.m. in the Rite 13 room (Chapel of the Innocents). Class members and their parents should fill out participant covenants during church school enrollment. *We still need additional mentors for this group, so if you would like the opportunity to nurture and support our youth, please talk to Mother Deborah.*

Journey to Adulthood, for youth in the 8th and 9th grades, will meet from 9:15-10:20 a.m. in the former Boaz office (next to the nursery). Mentors will be Andy Murphy,

Graig Fergusson, and Julia DerBedrosian.

Young Adults in Church, for youth in the 10th-11th grades, will meet in the downstairs youth room (where you were last year). Mentors will be Andrea Hawkins, Cathy Whitener, and Chris Davies.

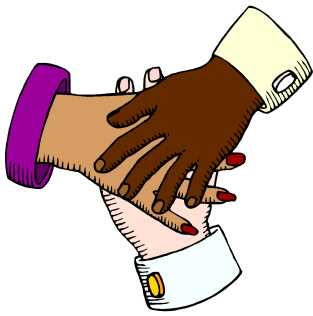

VESTRY MINUTES

July 21, 2011

A special vestry meeting was held on July 21, 2011. The meeting was called to order with a prayer at 7:40 p.m. in the Ross Room.

The meeting was called into executive session by the Rector's Warden Paul Ambos to discuss a letter of resignation that was submitted by Reverend Meister.

Upon exiting executive session the following resolutions were passed by the unanimous vote of all those present:

Resolved, That the Vestry of Christ Church, New Brunswick, accepts with regret the letter of resignation of the Reverend Dr. Deborah A. Meister as Rector of Christ Church, effective as to regular duties as of August 21, 2011 but with a last Sunday on September 18, 2011.

Resolved, That Christ Church requests the continuation of the agreement with Deacon Peter Cornell during the vacancy of the rectorship, subject to the approval of the Bishop Diocesan.

Resolved, That the Wardens and the Chair of the Personnel Committee as soon as feasible make a recommendation to the Vestry for a selection and for terms of agreement for an Interim,



subject to the approval of the Bishop Diocesan.

Resolved, That, pursuant to paragraph 5 of the Equity Share Agreement dated as

Deborah met with the Vestry only last Thursday to announce her acceptance of a call to St. Alban's in Washington, but we are moving quickly with plans for her Farewell Sunday on September 18 and for the appointment of an Interim Rector to serve Christ Church during the transition. After taking some time on Thursday to express both our sorrow at her leaving and our gratitude for her ministry among us, the Vestry met with the Rev. Lee Powers, Diocesan Canon for Transition Ministry, and his assistant, Cecilia Alvarez. We had a thorough discussion of the transition process, including appointment of an Interim, Parish Self-Study, and search for our next Rector. The procedures are outlined in a brochure, *The Discernment Process in the Diocese of New Jersey*, which is available at the back of the church or in the office.

The Wardens and Vestry have asked our Deacon, Pete Cornell, to continue to serve during the transition, and with the approval of Bishop Cancell, Pete has agreed to do so. We are deeply grateful to have his continuing pastoral and liturgical support.

The Vestry will be meeting for a retreat on Saturday, September 10, to reflect on what our parish has achieved in our five years with Deborah and where we may be led by the Spirit in the years ahead. The retreat will be led by the Rev. Barbara Crafton, a noted retreat leader and spiritual director and an award-winning author. Her e-mail meditations, *The Almost-Daily eMo*, are read by tens of thousands of subscribers.

Our Vestry Co-Chairs for Special Events, Chizoba Nwankwo and Marie Thompson, will be leading a team of parishioners to organize the farewell celebration. Please let them know if you would like to help: chiznwan@yahoo.com or mariethompson2@aol.com.

We will be working hard to provide information to you as soon as it is available, and we will try to answer individual questions or concerns. Dear Friends,

I am thrilled to be writing you in this month's Close Call as your newly-called Director of Music. It has been a joy to become part of your ministry here at Christ Church in the past year, and I am very excited to have the opportunity to continue to facilitate and guide the very good work that you have done here over the years. As I step into this role, I wish first to acknowledge some of my very capable predecessors that have worked with you to build the program into what it is today: George Wilmot; George Huddleston; John Van Sant; Clifford Hill; Jack Spencer; and most especially, Mark Trautman. We are the very fortunate inheritors of the hard work and devotion of these past music direc-

tors, and we can certainly be thankful for our vital music outreach ministry here at Christ Church, which is their legacy.

In my first communication with you in these pages last October, I identified four key characteristics of the music outreach ministry at Christ Church: excellence; outreach; inclusiveness; and enthusiasm. I believe these characteristics have continued to typify this ministry during the past season, whether it was the excellence of the December concert with the New Brunswick Chamber Orchestra or the real growth in ability and leadership in *Canticum Novum*; or whether it was the outreach of a massed choir of 60 singers at the Interfaith Thanksgiving service, or Christ Church choirs' involvement in diocesan events; or whether it was the continued inclusion of

hymnody and service music from the African-American heritage in LEVAS II or musical styles ranging from classical to jazz to gospel in our worship services; or whether it was the continued enthusiasm of all in our hymn singing and willingness to step up and be part of this ministry.

These characteristics continue to be key. I look forward to continued growth in these key areas in the upcoming season, as well as in the areas of education, service, outreach beyond our walls, and a continued vision of ministry that supports us all on our journeys, wherever we might be.

I invite any and all of you to take part in this outreach ministry at Christ Church, whether by joining one of the choirs, by attending the concert series, or—especially—by singing our great hymns with enthusiasm and fervor!

Meanwhile, please remember that our Summer Choir continues through the last Sunday in August. Any and all are welcome, invited and encouraged to join us in the chancel any of those Sundays at 9:00 a.m. Each Sunday will learn an easy anthem

which we then will sing at the 10:00 a.m. service.

Our regular choral season resumes on Sunday, September 4th. Christ Church will also present a concert series during the 2011-2012 season—more to come on that in the next issue of the *Close Call*.

I wish to extend my most heartfelt thanks to all of you who expended so much time and energy in the music director search. I am deeply grateful for your work and for your support.

This fall, we will move to a new pattern. Worship on the second Sunday of the month will be anchored by Canticum Novum, who have developed so well under the sure guidance of John Sheridan that they are now ready to take on that level of responsibility. The Youth Choir and the St. Cecilia Ensemble will no longer be tied to one particular Sunday a month, but will be scheduled with greater flexibility, allowing them to learn anthems which are seasonally appropriate, to share their gifts with more of our parishioners, and to sing with and enjoy the mentorship of our adult choirs. Children and youth who now serve as ushers and lectors will be mixed into the regular rota, so that, on many Sundays, we will be able to hear the whole people of God proclaim the whole Gospel¹.

That is, in the end, what God wants to see: all of God's people living God's good news, each day, in

every place, sharing a word of hope, of blessing, of encouragement, and of new life. Over and over in the past years, we have drawn on the strength of our traditions to break old patterns which were constricting us, to seek out new ways to serve one another and our neighbors in God's name, to join together in praise. Each of these was a resurrection decision: to seek out new and abundant life wherever it was to be found. You have challenged me, encouraged me, and inspired me in our work together. And so I'd like to end where I began, with the words we sang at my Institution: O, Sing unto the Lord a new song!

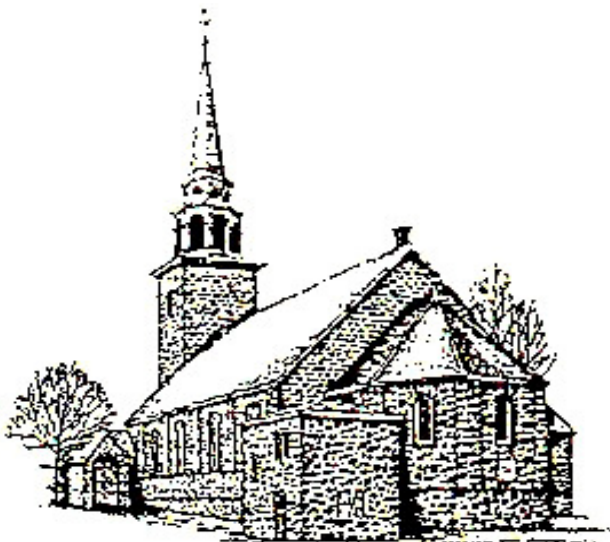
